8	The Chair called the meeting to order at 6:33pm and stated Jared will vote for John and Bill will vote for

11	Topics
12	 6:30 pm – Bruce Berry, DPW- Reconstruction of Nathan Lord Rd
13	B. Berry along with E. Hahn presented the project as follows:
14	Project Narrative

The Town of Amherst Department of Public Works is proposing to reconstruct the full 15 16 length of Nathan Lord Road ("the Road"). The Road was built in the 1970's and has deteriorated beyond the point of simply overlaying the paved surface. The DPW Director 17 suspects saturation of the underlying gravels as well as poor quality of the select gravels 18 and is, therefore, proposing full depth reconstruction. The scope of work generally consists 19 of removing the pavement and the underlying select gravels to a depth 22-inches below 20 the proposed finished grade and reconstructing it with 18- inches of State specification 21 gravel and 4-inches of new pavement. Underdrains will be added where necessary. The 22 proposed finished grade matches existing payement grade within a few inches. 23

25 Reconstruction of the Road also involves closing the drainage cross section from the intersection of the Road and Boylston Terrace all the way to the intersection of the Road 26 and Route 122 (Boston Post Road). Today, the entire length has an open drainage 27 28 section. The high point in the Road is just beyond the intersection with Boylston Terrace. 29 The water within the roadside swales settles near the intersection with Boston Post 30 Road and flows to Beaver Brook through an existing 24-inch corrugated metal pipe. The 31 Town of Amherst enjoys an easement over Tax Map 3; Lot 60-3, which is 20-feet in width and allows the drainage outfall from the Road to Beaver Brook. Beaver Brook is a 32 fourth order stream subject to Shoreland Protection. Roadway reconstruction involves 33 replacing the existing CMP with HDPEP. The pipe is upsized from a 24-inch pipe to a 36-34 inch pipe to increase the hydraulic capacity according to our storm water analysis. For 35 the most part, the pipe remains in its existing location. However, the outlet is shifted 36 37 approximately 5-feet downstream from its current discharge point. Today, the pipe outlets at the exact location of a beaver dam. The dam is approximately 18-inches to 2-38 feet in height and causes the existing drainage line to surcharge even during periods of 39 40 no flow. By moving the discharge downstream of the beaver dam, the pipe is clear and able to freely discharge. 41

Work in the Wetland jurisdiction is limited to removing the existing pipe and installing a
new pipe and outlet headwall. We have estimated a 2-foot width for the impact, along
with the entire length of the easement area (20-feet).

46 Jared asked if there is any other option other than draining into Beaver Brook. No, that is the only option

- 47 and that's what's been done historically.

- 49 Rich asked if this is an intermittent stream.

50 B. Berry said there's lots of water in that area. There is a perennial stream up there that has different

- requirements and will stay in its current state. The goal is to reduce the free water that is saturating the
- 52 road. They will give the water a place to go by creating piping direction without letting it find its own 53 route.
- 54 Daryl was concerned about the quality of water going into Beaver Brook and then the Souhegan River.
- 55 She wanted to talk to George May from Souhegan watershed association but he couldn't get to the
- 56 meeting. Daryl said they monitor the Souhegan River water quality all summer mostly for e coli. She
- 57 used to test the Beaver Brook outflow. George wanted to test just below Beaver Brook because the
- 58 numbers are higher there. She asked when they expect the construction work to start. Late May/ early
- June. Daryl and Bruce decided they should further discuss the testing at another time to make sure theyare not duplicating work.

- 62 W. Robertson arrived at this time.
- 63
- E. Hahn said the flow may be stronger for a month or so, but then the top soil levels will dry a bit andbecome less spongy and the flow will level out to be the same as it is now.

- 67 J. Hardner asked how the filtration works.
- 68 B. Berry said the same way a septic system works- but in reverse. Hydro carbons stay on the top. It
- 69 doesn't flush out in a high flow time- it stays trapped. It will be maintained annually.
- 70 J. Hardner asked if the wetland on the property at the corner is affected by changing the flow in that
- 71 area. They don't think it will be.
- 72

J. Hardner moved to approve the proposal and to have Daryl sign it. W. Robertson seconded. All in favor with B. Widmer abstaining.

- 98 The case they were supposed to hear was tabled. Nothing to report.

- 104 Meadows, Forests, Invasives- Lee
- 105 <u>Forests:</u> Jared said he, Lee and John met with a wildlife ecologist and county forester from UNH and
- talked strategy for forest management and did a site walk at Joppa Hill. He has asked them to come to
- 107 the next ACC meeting on April 26th to give a presentation and answer questions. He put material online
- 108 for the ACC to review prior to the presentation. One topic of interest is that we clear ½ acre clearings
- which is good for wildlife but that generic approach might not be best. We may not be accomplishingwhat we think we are.
- 111 Lee said through the presentation we should get a better understanding of how the management
- practices we've been using impact wildlife and how we can alter what we do to impact wildlife. Then we will make strategies and set goals.
- 114 Daryl asked if the ACC will learn enough from the presentation to make intelligent decisions with
- managing individual properties. Jared mentioned the ACC has a forester, a county forester and the UNH
- resources to help us. The ACC just needs to get up to speed with the concepts.
- 117 Jared said meadows management is directly related. The meadows management is directly affected by
- 118 managing the forests. It's been 20 years since the management plan was written and the forester is on
- 119 board with developing this process.
- 120 Meadows: Lee said contracts are getting set. No changes are planned for the meadows other than
- 121 ramping up.
- 122 Invaisives: Lee has the permit drafted he's just waiting for a list of Town-owned buildings from the office
- 123 so he can include them all in the permit.

- Daryl asked about the tree that was dangerous. Lee and Wes cut off the top portion and pulled it back inthe opposite direction.

- 128 <u>Trails</u>
 - Sub-committee update
- 130 Wes updated the ACC on everything the sub-committee has done. The 1st meeting was in November.
- 131 They talked about their mission and objectives of creating the trails manual and public outreach. They
- 132 met in January and started planning the hike of the month, social media and coordination with the Rec
- 133 Dept. They added to the ACC website. John began work on the trail manual and they distributed lots of
- information to the group the Milford trail manual and Amherst information that will inform theAmherst trail manual.
- 136 They met in March and honed some plans for trail of the month info to get into the newspapers. They
- 137 looked at the trails manual in further detail. Jared set them up with a dropbox area. Ordinances may
- 138 come out of the discussions they are having.
- 139 Daryl asked to have the ACC updated regularly.

- 150 Rich showed examples of the posters he will display at the fair and the commission made some edits to 151 the information. He is looking into putting the posters up at the library after the event is over.

- 153 Daryl mentioned the ACC will have a booth on Fourth of July. The commission brainstormed that there 154 should be trail information for people to scan into their phones at the booth.

- 156 Land/Easements
- 157 Daryl discussed the Sherburne Lot across the river from Simeon Wilson Rd. It's after the athletic field
- and runs to the river. It's 15 acres. The Rec Dept has asked if the ACC minds cutting back some of the
- 159 trees that are encroaching on the playing field and cut additional trees and use the area parking.
- 160 Lee said there are invaisives throughout that area.
- 161 The trees are encroaching on the softball field. In addition, they would like to have some parking there
- 162 because there is no parking on Simeon Wilson Rd. Lee has had discussions before and noticed that trees
- are encroaching many ball fields and tree maintenance is needed.

- 165 The commission reviewed the maps and photos and discussed the pros and cons of allowing a parking
- 166 lot on that property.
- 167
- 168 To do list:
- 169 -Walk the site and find the property boundaries and establish which trees are in question.
- 170 -Get legal advice so this does not become precedence.

172 Round Table

- 173 Wes spoke to Aaron Bagshaw- the coach of the high school bike racing team and the team is interested
- in a community service project to help with the trails. The commission discussed the ACC email systemwhich didn't seem successful in this instance.
- 176 W. Robertson moved to make the ACC alias email distribute to all of the commissioners. J. Hardner
- 177 seconded. All in favor

- J. Hardner suggested taking the team for a day of work and that will either be the end of it or if it worksout well and they want to do more the ACC can discuss another project.

- 182 Frank reported they did a lot of pruning at the orchard over the last two weeks and they will be working183 on the Old Mail Road Trail next weekend.

- 185 Daryl shared that Zack Anton received his Eagle Scout and the ACC is invited to the ceremony. The
- 186 invitation was shown.

- 188 Lee will be directing a mushroom cultivation hands- on training session. The sign- up is coming out very 189 soon.

- 190 The commission discussed a logging project and also a run that is coming up soon on the trails and what 191 needs to occur to make everything go smoothly.

193 Jared mentioned the action plan that's coming out of the strategy. He printed copies and handed them

out because commissioners have action items assigned with dates attached. He reminded them that thisinformation is in the dropbox.

- 197 Rich added to what Frank said that the upper orchard has been completely pruned. They will be working198 on the lower orchard tomorrow or Friday.

Daryl talked to Craig the Recreation Director about doing a 'paddle' down the river sponsored by the
 ACC and Rec Dept. She wondered if Rich could lead one and talk about the wildlife/ habitat.

- The commission discussed having a town-wide event going down the river and supplying kayaks and a shuttle.

Simon attended a land conference and he will update the commission over the next few weeks aboutthe presentations.

208 Wes mentioned the trail sub- committee is short a person. The commission discussed if Frank should 209 even be on that committee at this point or if it should be a five-member group.
