
What to Do

1. Work with a partner. One person will do the mazes. The other person will be a recorder.


2. You should place your pencil or pen on the START arrow. Your partner will say "go."

3. Find the path from "START" to 'FINISH." Your partner

will record how many seconds it takes you to complete the three mazes. 4. Record each of the three trials in the chart to the right. Were you able to improve your times? 5. Graph your results in the bar graph to the right. Does the bar graph show that each time you completed the mazes in less time?
