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## Town of Amherst, NH BOARD OF SELECTMEN MEETING MINUTES

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16	5.2 Steeple Repairs		
17	Chairman Brew stated that the Town of Amherst owns the steeple portion of the Amherst		
18	Congregational Church and there are some improvements that need to be made to it,		
19	including electrical repairs, and alarm system and electrical system upgrades. Both		
20	Charlie Vars, the project manager, and DPW Director Eric Hahn believe the project		
21	scope is appropriate.		
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23	A MOTION was made by Selectman Grella and SECONDED by Selectman Lyon to		
24	approve the repairs to the Town-owned Church Steeple and to authorize the use of town		
25	funds to cover the cost of the repairs in the amount of \$7,400.00.

England feel of Amherst. He would like to see the open space in town continue to be

preserved in the proper fashion. Due to his work background in legal asset management compliance, he believes he will be a good fit for making for the requests to the Planning Board comply with the laws.

A MOTION was made by Selectman Lyon and SECONDED by Selectman Panasiti to appoint Brian Coogan to the Planning Board as an Alternate Member of the Board, effective immediately, with a term expiration date of 2021.

## **5.3 Unanticipated Funds – DPW**

Chairman Brew explained that there was a guardrail damaged last year, but replaced this year with funds from this year's budget. A check from the insurance company has been received and deposited into unanticipated revenue. The request is to move that money back into the Guardrail line to reimburse it.

A MOTION was made by Selectman Grella and SECONDED by Selectman Panasiti to accept payment from MMG Insurance Company for damage to Baboosic Lake Road guardrail and authorize expenditure from 01-4312-60-2684, Guardrails, to partially pay for the replacement of the guardrail.

## 5.4 FY20 Budget & Warrant Articles Discussion

Chairman Brew explained that he would like to first discuss the Letter to the Editor written by Selectman D'Angelo. The first issue to discuss is that of an individual Board member making a statement to the public without also stating all of the facts involved. The second issue is to discuss the items brought up in the Letter to the Editor.

 Chairman Brew stated that he believes this Board works well together. There are opinions that differ but everyone listens respectfully to each other. He believes it is important that any issues are discussed only at Board meetings, so that all sides are heard at once and the rationale behind them is as well. He explained that any article that only chooses one side and the certain facts to support it is a disservice to the residents. He would like, going forward, for the Board to communicate as a Board and capture all issues. If an individual feels that something more needs to be discussed with the public, this can be brought up at a Board meeting where all sides can be equally represented.

Selectman D'Angelo stated that there wasn't anything in his opinion piece that he hasn't also stated at an open Board meeting.

Chairman Brew agreed, but at open Board meetings issues are surrounded by overall Board content, whereas in an opinion piece individual things can be picked out that, while true, may be taken out of context and not capture the entire dialogue.

Chairman Brew and Selectman D'Angelo discussed the possibility of presenting two opinion articles instead, or one larger article with all sides represented.

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Selectman D'Angelo stated that context matters, but this article was specifically an effort of persuasion on his part. When he ran for the Board there were two items in particular

88 that he disagreed with the Board on. As he was elected, he believes these two items are important to the public and thus he was trying to engage the voters and get their input. 89 90 91 Selectman Lyon explained that any of the Board members has a right to write a Letter to the Editor, but it would be nice to let the Board know ahead of time so that a counter 92 93 article could be written, or one larger article could be collaborated on. Selectman D'Angelo said that he would be happy to let the Board know ahead of time 94 95 next time, as he is not trying to be the only voice in the conversation. 96 97 Selectman Lyon stated that the article made it seem that Selectman D'Angelo was taking credit for the town's new road plan. It also seemed to shed the responsibility for the 98 99 undesignated fund balance issue onto the other four members of the Board. 100 Selectman D'Angelo explained that he wasn't trying to shed responsibility, but simply 101 asking people to come to the hearings to hear the Board and give their input. He believes 102 residents have been generally supportive of the ideas he's presented. 103 104 105 Chairman Brew believes people are supportive because not all of the facts were presented in the article. Selectman D'Angelo stated that he presented all of the facts when he ran for 106 the Board, but there wasn't enough room in the article to reiterate them again. He doesn't 107 believe the Boards planned to overtax the residents, but they have. 108 109 Selectman Lyon stated that that is simply not true. 110 111 Chairman Brew explained that, in terms of the unassigned fund balance, the GFOA 112 recommends maintaining a minimum balance of 17%, and the DRA recommends maintaining a minimum of 5-17%. The Board looked at all the information and 113 established a policy of its own at 10%. This article left out all of these recommended 114 numbers and the Board's rationale. 115 116 117 Selectman D'Angelo stated that there is more of a balance than there's been since 2012. 118 This was not done intentionally; it was taken accidentally over a six-year period, due to a combination of underestimating revenues and not spending the whole budget. The 119 question now is what to do with the excess. His position is that there are projects to be 120 121 funded over the next few years, such as bridges, where the balance could be used in order to remove the tax burden of these projects from the public. 122 123 124 Chairman Brew explained that the Board developed a policy with the intent to return 125 every dollar over a certain percentage to the taxpayer, not to spend it on projects. An effort is made to return the money without making the tax rate jump wildly. It's reasonable to 126 disagree with what percentage to return, but only if the opinion is put out with all the facts. 127 128

Selectman Grella pointed out that this policy was signed off on in 2016 by all five Board members. Now one member, Selectman D'Angelo appears to disagree with the policy, but

Selectman D'Angelo acknowledged this but refuses to not speak up simply because he lost

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that vote.

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it was put to a vote and carried through by a vote of 4-1-0.

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139 140	Chairman Brew stated that his goal is to make sure that all sides of information are put out there for the public, not just one. He hopes that, if anyone feels strongly on a subject, input			
141 142	will be sought from the rest of the Board and all of the facts will be presented so that the public can come to a better understanding.
