There were several protest petitions filed and the Board of Selectmen is in the process of verifying them. Town Administrator Dean Shankle has updated the BOS with the following information. More information will be available soon.

"Of the 7 articles covered by protest petitions 2 of them did not get 50% of the vote, and so failed: 41 and 51. Of the other 5 articles covered by protest petitions (40, 43, 49, 50, 52) none of them received the required 2/3 in order to pass if the protest petitions are valid. This means we need to follow the process set out in RSA 675:5."

Conservation Commission News (Big News!)

The Town of Amherst has announced the exciting news that due to the efforts of the Conservation Commission, Town Administrator Dean Shankle has signed a Purchase & Sale Agreement for the acquisition of additional conservation land consisting of three contiguous parcels totaling 178 acres in the Baboosic Lake Road, Grater Road and Pond Parish Road area. There is a specific process that needs to be followed including public hearings and the Planning Board and Conservation Commission reviewing the purchase as well. The BOS will post a schedule soon. Thank you to the voters for passing the bond in 2021 which will fund this potential purchase.

Board of Selectmen Meeting Highlights

March 13:

- The Board heard from many concerned residents about traffic, noise, safety and other concerns in the Village. The Safety Committee will be asked to review these issues and recommend a plan to the BOS.
- Determined Martial Arts was approved to hold an Easter Egg Hunt on the Town Green on April 8
- The Milford Rotary was approved to sell raffle tickets at their annual golf tournament
- The Town continues to await the state's instructions on the town's PFAS report
- The Town Administrator addressed the requirements for political signs, name and contact info. is required
- The Board approved hiring Bruce Mayberry to update the Impact Fee Schedule
- Approvals were given for the Mont Vernon Road bridge construction (Neil Daniels, Inc.) and construction engineering services to GPI (contingent upon formal approval from NHDOT)
- Bids for the Spring Road culvert repair were reviewed and all 3 came in considerably higher than the estimate from Hoyle Tanner. The Board agreed to allow Hoyle Tanner to contact the three bidders to give them the opportunity to revise their bids.
- One bid was received for the Spring Road microsurfacing project. This work will be put out for a second bid as the one bid was considerably higher than anticipated.


March 27:

- A public hearing to accept a \$15,000 donation to the Conservation Commission was held and the BOS accepted the donation.
- The NRPC will complete their road study and counts of pedestrians, bicyclists in April
- Several inactive escrow accounts were closed.
- The BOS voted to approved the hiring of a DPW driver/laborer Patrick Ryan

Amherst Public Works Food Waste Diversion/Composting Program

The Town's food waste program has been very successful to date. The best week to date was the week ending 3/24/23 when **720 pounds** of food waste was diverted! Weekly totals since the food waste diversion program was instituted in February were 150 lbs, 320 lbs, 300 lbs, 560 lbs, 440 lbs and most recently 720 lbs. Way to go Amherst!

DPW has also recently changed food waste vendors and there is a slight change to the program. Bones and shellfish/shells can no longer be accepted. See the graphic below for more information.

A request from Chairman Will Ludt:




