

## **Board of Selectmen Meeting Highlights**

#### July 10:

- A public hearing was held on the revised Impact Fee Schedule; no public comment.
- Tim Greene, of the accounting firm Roberts & Greene, presented the FY22 audit report to the BOS. The town was given a clean opinion with a couple of recommendations. They will be back later this month to begin the FY23 audit.
- The ACC presented a revision to the Herbicides Use Policy. This was a collaborative effort with research conducted and input sought from the state Division of Pesticides. New notification standards to properties that will be treated will be in place.
- The BOS approved resolutions necessary to complete the issuance of the note for the purchase of Lot 6-9 of the Curran property for conservation purposes.
- The BOS discussed the lease/purchase of storage tanks and contract for magnesium chloride for winter treatment of roads. Item was postponed in order to receive updated documents and information.

#### **July 24:**

- Members for the new Energy Committee were selected; 9 town residents volunteered to join this committee! It was a very difficult task to appoint just 5 among the qualified group members. Thank you all.
- Liz Overholt, Town Treasurer provided an update of town bank balances. She also submitted her resignation but will stay on to assist the new Treasurer with the duties.
- A draft meeting room audio/visual RFP was presented but requires further modification
- The BOS 2024 calendar was approved
- The BOS agreed to move forward one year the Bertha Rogers Trust Fund committee
- The Board accepted the FY24 Highway Safety Grant
- The BOS awarded the annual FY24 heating oil contract to Haffner's Energy North for a fixed price of \$2.89/gal and the annual FY24 propane contract o Bot-L-Gas for a fixed price of \$1.375/gal. Both vendors were the low bidders.
- The FY24 tree work/maintenance bid was awarded to John Brown & Sons, Inc.
- The BOS approved the hire of Bruce Bowler as the Road Foreman (vacant since May)
- "Goldens on the Green" was given approval to hold their event on October 15
- An issue with the engine availability for the Tyne Pumper that is currently on order was presented to the BOS. The BOS approved the change in engine if there is no availability for the ordered engine.


