

mention of building a trail with the development, but it would be private to them. There is some wet land in the area. The Board also discussed and approved the cutting of some trees on Ponemah Road. A non-agenda item was briefly discussed regarding removal of dead trees along 5 scenic roads in town. The Commission discussed how appropriate the removal of a large number of trees would be. This will be discussed more at a future Planning Board meeting.

In response to a question from Mr. Harvey, Mr. Clemens stated that there will be a walk of the previously discussed possible development area on Brookwood Drive, on the 18th at 10:30 a.m. It will be open to interested parties.

VI. 2018/19 Budget Request

Mr. Clemens explained that he, Mr. Hardner, and Mr. Harvey worked on a presentation to the Board of Selectmen regarding next year's budget. The presentation went well and they received good comments back.

Mr. Hardner agreed that the Board gave the Commission accolades on their work, although it seemed unsure if there will be enough money in the budget to accommodate all of the items the Commission has submitted for. He also stated that this meeting was also a good trial run for the strategic plan.

Mr. Harvey explained that the Board asked that the Commission come by their meetings more often with interesting topics to present to them.

The Commission discussed putting forth a warrant article in order to aid the conservation fund from the capital reserve fund. Mr. Clemens stated that he would research some old warrant articles and begin the process.

In response to a question from Mr. Widmer, Mr. Clemens explained that there will be an item in next year's budget to cover a public outreach position for Ms. Kristan Patenaude. Mr. Harvey explained that there are also high school/college interns interested in helping the Commission to make some short films on some of the trails.

VII. Conservation Plan Update

Mr. Hardner stated that the current draft plan is being peer reviewed by Amanda Stone at the UNH Cooperative Extension. The Commission discussed utilizing different databases in order to make the plan more robust. Mr. Hardner also discussed doing more direct outreach to landowners in town to raise their awareness.

VIII. Trail Development and Use

a. SCA Field Data Collection

Mr. Corson explained that the SCA mapped the Haseltine trails using the Trimble and the data will be compared to the town's map data as soon as he receives it.

b. Trail Brochure Development

Mr. Clemens stated that that he, Mr. Bennison, and Mr. Corson discussed the value of something in addition to the walk book and the town website in order to bring the public's attention to the trails. A brochure with general info about the

ACC and the trail networks in town would be cheaper to reproduce and nice to handout at many venues. Mr. Bennison and Mr. Hart agreed to work with Ms. Patenaude in order to draft up a brochure.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Harvey and SECONDED by Mr. Bennison to allocate up to \$250 from the town budget in order to design a trail brochure file to be printed in the future.

Voting: all aye. Motion carried unanimously.

In response to a question from Mr. Clemens, Mr. Robertson explained that the granite stacked up on Nathaniel Drive is to complete the Eagle Scout project of rebuilding the stairs.

Mr. Hardner explained that the mountain bike community put forth a huge effort in the northern part of town to remove all of the downed trees from the storm.

Mr. Bennison stated that he has blazed the Currier trail. The next step will be to put up a kiosk.

Mr. Harvey and Mr. Robertson discussed a parcel on Wilson Hill that is in Merrimack, but partially owned by the ACC. Mr. Harvey explained that a private citizen put a trail on town property without permission. Mr. Clemens explained that this parcel has a long legal history regarding what can be done on it. There won't be legal recourse for the private citizen putting up a trail, but only because of legal efforts taken by the ACC in the past. Mr. Clemens wants to make sure this issue doesn't happen again in the future. The Commission then discussed the procedure for new trail development. Mr. Harvey and Mr. Bennison agreed to help the trail development group begin to meet again.

IX. Bike and Pedestrian Survey

Mr. Simon Corson discussed the Community Development Office's Bike and Pedestrian survey. The survey was released several months ago in order to help create a master plan. Mr. Corson asked the Commissioners to take the survey, if possible.

Mr. Hardner stated that the subcommittee is trying to hammer out a mission statement and a list of projects that can be accomplished.

X. Property Updates – Arnold/Sky Meadow

Mr. Clemens stated that the Commission went before the Board of Selectmen on the 23rd in order to receive formal approval to acquire the Arnold property. The meeting went smoothly and the presentation was appreciated. Mr. Clemens got authority from the Board of Selectmen to use Mr. Jim O'Mara as an agent. He's unsure on the current progress of things, but is hoping to close before the end of the year.

XI. Lindabury Orchard Update

Mr. Hart updated the Commission on the status and projects of Lindabury Orchard.

Mr. Harvey presented the Commission with an article he found in Forest Society magazine, regarding a seldom used conservation restriction RSA. The RSA allows a land owner to get a tax break and put a permanent easement on their land, as long as it has high conservation value. He suggested advertising this tool to the public for tax savings in the future. XII.
