

VI. Update on Eagle Scout Project – Sam Newman

Mr. Newman was not able to appear before the Commission, but his mother presented the group with before/after pictures. She explained that Mr. Newman did so well with his car wash fundraiser at the fire station, that he was able to buy 5 stone steps. He also installed traction strips on the bridge, and replaced the old sign and post.

The Commission approved and signed off on Mr. Newman's project.

VII. Amherst Forest Assessment

Mr. Ethan Belair introduced himself and explained his job and current projects to the group.

Mr. Hardner explained that it might be helpful to bounce drafts of the Forest Management Plan off of Mr. Belair, if possible. He'd also like for Mr. Belair to help the group with invasive species outreach strategies for the community.

Mr. Belair explained that many private landowners could have sources for invasive species in their acreage and not even know it. Generally, if people are educated about this, they are concerned and want to do what they can to help. He hopes that Amherst could be a pilot project town for developing the process of an educational program.

 The Commission discussed the emerald ash borer and its effect on the town of Amherst. Mr. Belair explained that Amherst is in a quarantine town and that ash trees harvested here cannot be sent to a non-quarantine town. The group discussed educational opportunities for this issue. Mr. Belair explained that the death rate for ash trees infected is 100% and the only effective management strategy is to reduce the emerald ash borer's spread. Within 5 years all of the ash trees in Amherst will be infected, and in another 5 years after that all of the ash trees will be dead.

The Commission discussed having Mr. Belair come and do a Town Hall-type meeting and a forest walk-through with any interested members of the public. Mr. Clemens stated that they will try to set up this meeting before March 14th at PMEC.

VIII. 2018 Warrant Article Support

Mr. Clemens explained that he would like to take the fact sheet that Mr. Hardner created for the 2 warrant articles and spin it into a Facebook blurb, an article for the newspaper, a flyer, etc.

A MOTION was made by Mr. Hardner and SECONDED by Mr. Harvey to allocate up to \$200 from the education fund for Ms. Kristan Patenaude to create educational support materials regarding the upcoming warrant articles.

IX. Conservation Plan Approval

A MOTION was made by Mr. Harvey and SECONDED by Mr. Bennison to accept the submitted Conservation Plan as the Commission's active plan.

102		after and dedicated to Mr. Long.

106		Mr. Hardner discussed with the group an idea for grooming certain trails around town
107		during the winter. He set forth 3 ideas for grooming: snowshoeing, purchasing a SnowDog
108		(which lays down heavier tracks than a snowmobile), or a snowmobile. Mr. Hardner stated
109		that he was approached by a couple of mountain bikers in town who are willing to purchase
110		a SnowDog and allow it to be used for grooming of trails.
111		Mr. Clemens explained that the group would need to agree which trails should be groomed,
112		before giving specific people in town permission to groom them. He also wants to reach
113		out to the Recreation Department, while Mr. Hardner talks with NEMBA, before making
114		any decisions.
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116		Mr. Hardner explained that he would like the Commission to allow mountain bikers to tidy
117		up along the Hemlock Trail next summer, after logging has been completed.
