# 1. Roll Call to Order

Will Ludt called the meeting to order at 6:30pm.

# **TOPICS OF DISCUSSION:**

## 2. "Throw Back" Thursday – Amherst Heritage

Will Ludt stated that Tom Grella has been working to get the Commission a site walk of the mineral springs off Spring Road. Tom Grella explained that there is a small stream with water bubbling out of a pipe in this location. Will Ludt noted that this was a destination during the 19<sup>th</sup> century. The Commission agreed to try to tour this location in August.

# 3. Potential for the Re-naming of Several Trails in Amherst – Chris Buchanan

Chris Buchanan, Chair of the Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee, explained that one of the group's main projects is the Baboosic Greenway, a regional initiative that will hopefully someday span five towns and run across two railbeds to make a shared path. The branch through town is the Manchester-Milford Branch. It was constructed solely to drive a competing railroad company out of business, but never turned a profit for the railroad. Eventually, it was decommissioned, and the ties and rails were pulled in 1930. The NH DOT took over the route and held it until the 1980s, when it was split into individual parcels which were absorbed into other parcels in the towns. It will likely take decades to get all parties along the route to agree to a shared easement. Parcels that do not wish to participate have to be bypassed. The Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee, along with other entities in other towns, are seeking to piece together the route.

 Chris Buchanan explained that much of the route in question would run from Bedford into Amherst. There is a roadside portion along Amherst Street that runs into Milford to the Granite Town Rail Trail, which then runs to the Massachusetts border. Another portion in Amherst runs to the south, which could one day connect to the School Campus project. Currently, the NH DOT has awarded the project \$1.9M in funding to expand approximately three miles. A 20% match will be fundraised for. It will take several years to secure the matching funding. The State funding comes in two phases. It would extend a roadside treatment along Amherst Street/Boston Post Road to Walnut Hill Road along the railbed, with some potential deviations along that route. Approximately 0.7 miles of this will be along the roadside. Near Birch Park, there would be a ramp that would lead down to the railbed.

In response to a question from Will Ludt, Chris Buchanan stated that it is unclear what fiscal years this would occur in until the Governor reviews the proposal this summer. The funding will not be available earlier than 2025 and could expand until 2029. This is proposed to be a shared use path. The Committee has put together a draft document with language regarding what will be allowed on the path. It is not intended for ATVs or snow mobiles.

In response to a question from Tom Grella regarding potential water crossings, Chris Buchanan explained that water crossings have tripled in cost since 2018. He explained that there is one water crossing along the route and a boardwalk is proposed in that area because it is not very large.

Chris Buchanan explained that the current State 10-Year Plan named this project the Baboosic Greenway. Amherst owns portions of the railbed already. The Conservation Commission maintains part of that route along what is called the B&M Trail. It seems logical to call the route now what it will be called when it is built. This could be useful for fundraising and utility. The B&M Trail name does not necessarily represent the history of the route accurately. The Conservation Commission asked for the Heritage Commission's opinion on this.

Will Ludt stated that he likes the name Baboosic Greenway but would like to also pay homage to the B&M (Boston & Maine) side. He suggested Baboosic Greenway-B&M Trail. Once the name is lost, it will be lost forever.

Conor Frain asked how parts of the Greenway will be delineated. He suggested that this could be the B&M segment of the Baboosic Greenway, as it will stretch through a number of towns. Some local place names could be incorporated to allow for better place finding.

Chris Buchanan explained that the Greenway is proposed to run southward from Amherst Street, crossing Boston Post Road, under Route 101, with some easements to the south already in place. He agreed that the entire project could have one name, with ways to identify locations and the history of specific segments. This could include historic markers along the way.

Will Ludt asked about including an existing abutment located behind Shaw's in Milford into the route. Chris Buchanan noted that this would likely cost approximately \$6M.

 Chris Buchanan stated that he would like to see naming conventions for the route created, such as heritage-based or donor-based. This plan needs to be finalized between now and 2026. The project will be called the Baboosic Greenway by the State. In terms of renaming a portion of the route through the Conservation Commission, this can be done as the groups see fit.

Lisa Montesanto stated that she would like to consider this item further. She noted that she would not like to lose the B&M Trail name. She asked why this was decided to be called the Baboosic Greenway. Chris Buchanan explained that this was the name given due to the significance of Baboosic Lake along the route.
