6 I. Call to Order

Chairman Will Ludt called the meeting to order sharply at 7:29 PM.

### II. "Throw Back" Thursday – Amherst Heritage

Chairman Ludt handed out bookmarks from the LiDAR stone wall mapping project that he created.

### III. Topics of Discussion

### 1. Lighting Proposal for Village

Chairman Ludt explained that Chris Buchanan met with the group last April regarding a town lighting project. He has recently gotten back in touch with the Commission and is hoping for their support in moving forward with the project. This project is supported by the Historic District Commission. Mr. Bement and Ms. Montesanto volunteered to be the lead persons from the Heritage Commission to aid Mr. Buchanan in this project. Currently, the hope is to install one pathfinder light in the Village and see what the opinion of the public is.

In response to a comment from Mr. Grella, Mr. Corson stated that he will discuss the project with DPW Director, Eric Hahn.

### 2. Feedback on NH Stone Wall Identification Training Session – 19 January 2019 Mr. Frain stated that he found the training to be helpful. The group discussed that the

Mr. Frain stated that he found the training to be helpful. The group discussed that the resolution of the LiDAR in some areas seems to be poor and is causing a bit of trouble identifying certain stone walls.

Chairman Ludt stated that the next phase of the project is to go out in the field and continue to use LiDAR to identify the stone walls in town.

### 3. Stone Wall Identification Meeting for the Public – March 2019 Meeting

Chairman Ludt stated that there's been some chatter on Facebook regarding interest in stone wall projects. He is recommending at the next meeting to invite the public to discuss the project and its findings.

Ms. Montesanto suggested inviting the public be pushed to either the April or May meeting. The Commission agreed.

### 4. Potential Field Site Visit by James Gage, Patch Hill Quarry

Chairman Ludt suggested a "field trip" for the Commission in June to visit the Patch Hill quarries. In updating the Historic Resources Survey with ArcGIS, it was noted that the quarries aren't currently identified on it, and this would be a chance to update it with this information.

### 5. Milestone Schedule/Assignments for 2019 Projects

- Town Master Plan (2020) in the fall the Commission will review its contribution to the last Master Plan.
- Brick School door and window project Chairman Ludt and Ms. Montesanto are the leads for this project. Work should begin next week.
- Metal Detecting Policy Chairman Ludt and Mr. Bement are the leads for this project.
- Patch Hill Quarry "field trip" Chairman Ludt is the lead.
- Amherst Historic Resource Mapping Support Mr. Frain and Mr. Bement are the leads.
- Stone Wall Identification Project All Commissioners are involved in this project.
- Perambulation Assistance Mr. Frain, and Chairman Ludt will assist Gordon Leedy with this project.
- Village Lighting Ms. Montesanto and Mr. Bement will aid Mr. Buchanan with this project.

### 6. Potential New Member of Heritage Commission and Resignation

Chairman Ludt stated that Larry McCoy has formally resigned from his position on the Heritage Commission.

Brenda Perry is a new potential member for the Commission. She will write a letter to the Board of Selectmen in order to be formally appointed to the Commission as an alternate member.
