TOPICS OF DISCUSSION:

2. Cooperage at Corn Crib – Status Update – Robert Adam Preservation Services Will Ludt explained that the Amherst Conservation Commission (ACC) recently cleared the Corn Crib Trail that runs from the Josiah Parker Trail to the Corn Crib. The ACC also extended the Josiah Parker Trail across Baboosic Lake Road to the B&M Rail Trail.

Will Ludt explained that Robert Adam recently completed a report on the Corn Crib and cooperage. He welcomed Robert Adam to share the report with the group.

In response to a question from Will Ludt, Robert Adam stated that the term "vernacular" refers to a structure that is grown organically from someone's design in their mind that follows traditions. This type of structure could include a barn, residence, roadside attraction, etc.

Will Ludt explained that Doug Nelson, a nearby abutter, would like to undertake stabilizing the Corn Crib cooperage structure as an alternative to razing it. Some of the improvements will include a new roof and a new foundation in one corner. The ACC has agreed to donate a small amount of money to fund such a restoration, and a private donor has already come forward.

 Robert Adam stated that, if the buildings can be saved, they should be. Farm buildings like this are quite rare in the area. He stated that, if the building goes another year without a covering on the back, it will continue to deteriorate. He suggested nailing or screwing 2x4's to the roof with sheet metal.

Will Ludt stated that he is going to contact the nearest landowner to see if he is interested in helping chip in for the restoration.

Conor Frain suggested that the group think about how much money needs to be raised and what they want the building to be.

Brenda Perry suggested that the Commission think about other similar structures in Town that meet need to be identified.

Tom Grella stated that he will discuss the project with Town Administrator Shankle to make sure that the Town is aware.

Robert Adam suggested that there be accurate architectural drawings made of the building prior to reconstruction, so that a type of replacement in kind can be made.

Conor Frain moved that the Heritage Commission take on the preservation and needed repairs of the Corn Crib cooperage as a project. Lisa Montesanto seconded. Roll call: Conor Frain – aye; Lisa Montesanto – aye; John Bement – aye; Brenda Perry – aye; Tom Grella – aye; and Will Ludt – aye. Motion carried unanimously.

Will Ludt thanked Robert Adam for his work and stated that the Commission will be making a small donation to the Shirley Meetinghouse Fund.

3. CLG Grant Submittal – 19 January 2021

Will Ludt stated that he has submitted a letter of intent to NH DHHR for funding to digitize and make accessible the Heritage Resource Survey with up-to-date technology, using QR code designs. The primary goal of the project is to get the historic heritage data out of the closet and into the hands of the public, bringing access of the information into the 21st century. The grant is a 60/40 grant, meaning that the Town will need to come up with a 40% match, in the form of volunteer time and donations. The grant will not pay for any signage needed for the project, so the Commission will need to fundraise for that part of the project. The grant will, however, cover the signage design. The grant application is due January 19, 2021. There have been 10-15 historic sites in Town already identified as part of this project.
