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3. CLG Grant Update – Review of in-kind hours

Sara Siskavich introduced Tyrel Borowitz, who has been helping to work on this project. She
explained that the group is at the halfway point of the grant. The second phase will include an
interactive mapping product, including scanned maps from Town records.

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Sara Siskavich explained that the map currently consists of 373 data points. There could be a tab
including place names. Approximately 6% of all residential homes in Town are pinned on this

26 map. She would like to get the assessing data to see if there is additional data to be added. All but27 63 of the pins currently have pictures associated with them. She would like to continue amassing
