36 37 38 39	Eric: On alternative routes the problem we may have missed an opportunity to suggest this route. Should we be doing this now? I think we should at least in our questions before March 23 ask them what they considered as alternate routes to laying the pipe in Amherst.
40	D'Angelo: The Bury's have already done this.
41 42 43	David B: Be careful - I don't think that KM is NOT bound to consider future routes.
43 44 45	Paul and Eric: I think we should ask them in greater detail how they got to decide upon the route

Eric H: Question suggestions - to what extend does liberty gas influence the route to Bon Terrain

metering station? D'Angelo: We have discussed where we don't want it and where it isn't good for the town. Jensen & David B: Let's put in the questions with 10 days notice - what is the alternative route that meets our criteria and the criteria of the FERC - avoiding Ponemah Bog ...
