8	J. D'Angelo called the meeting to order. A tentative meeting is set for June 30 at 3pm with
9	Kinder Morgan. This has not yet been confirmed. D'Angelo will reach out to KM to confirm
10	the date and time.
11	
12	J.M. Vore – a 12-town coalition has hired a lawyer – Amherst is not a part. J. D'Angelo-
13	currently the coalition does not have a scope of work/contract yet. If the coalition comes up with
14	a set of objectives that are reasonable, Amherst may consider joining.
15	
16	J. D'Angelo stated that Mason approved a warrant article authorizing \$80,000 in legal expenses.
17	The Town may have a similar warrant article on the March ballot. The group discussed hiring a
18 19	constitutional lawyer to represent the Town and timing on when representation might be needed.
20	The group discussed other Towns finding inaccuracies in the environmental report prepared by
20	KM. The taskforce may request that the ACC review for similar inaccuracies within Amherst.
22	Rivi. The taskforce may request that the ACC review for similar maccuracies within Annierst.
23	C. Lonsdale's draft document needs to be formatted and will then be posted. Once A. Jensen's
24	document is complete, the taskforce will take the summer off. Discussed an educational
25	campaign regarding the taskforce and reminding people about the project and the taskforce
26	efforts. During the upcoming primary season, candidates should be asked about their position on
27	the pipeline.
28	
29	Once the route is filed, the taskforce will address construction issues and concerns. Milford's
30	taskforce has done substantial work on this issue, and the ACC recommendations will be
31	incorporated into the taskforce document.
32	
33	The meeting was adjourned at approximately 9:00pm.
