II. Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Grant Announced

The New Hampshire Department of Transportation has announced "Round 4" of the TAP program this month, with letters of intent from applying towns due on February 5^{th} , 2021. This grant could cover the majority of the cost of the Boston Post Road School Campus Sidepath project, but likely would rely on the passage of Warrant Article 32 this March. https://www.nh.gov/dot/org/projectdevelopment/planning/tap/index.htm

Several details about the grant have finally been revealed:

- Minimum project limit is \$400,000 total dollars (\$320,000 federal)
- Maximum project limit is \$1,250,000 total dollars (\$1,000,000 federal)
- Project will require at least a 20% match provided by the applicant

Due to the limits of this grant, it is likely that the Boston Post Road School Campus Project in its current form would fail to reach the minimum project cost.

The committee should discuss this fact and whether other projects should be considered in this application.

III. 2021 Warrant Article

The BPAC's warrant article for the March 2021 town election has been established as Article 32.

ARTICLE 32: Establish and fund CRF for Amherst Multimodal Facilities

Shall the Town vote to establish an Amherst Multimodal Facilities Capital Reserve Fund under the provisions of RSA 35:1 for the purpose of design and construction of projects and provide matching funds for grants for such projects, and to raise and appropriate the sum of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000) to be placed in this

fund. Further, to name the Board of Selectmen as agents to expend from said fund. (Tax Impact = \$0.04) (Majority vote required)

- The Board of Selectmen and the Ways & Means committee have both voted unanimously to support this article
- Committee needs to finalize plan for communicating the content of the article to voters

IV. Other Initiatives

A. Souhegan Valley Rail Trail

Organization officially formed, meets 1st Tuesday of each month at 7pm. CSX has announced intention to purchase Pan American Railway's real estate holdings, including Hillsborough Branch rail line. The US Surface Transportation Board has regulatory authority over this transaction and will be soliciting public input. Efforts underway to negotiate with CSX about the inclusion of a rail trail within the right of way are to begin shortly, and to appeal to the Surface Transportation Board to consider this effort in the details of the sale.

V. NHDOT Statewide Ped-Bike Plan

- Amherst Street Sidepath (extensions into Milford and to Birch Park)
- A sidepath that connects to Bedford in the NH 101 corridor
- Souhegan Valley Rail Trail
